

Mesyuarat Jawatankuasa Bersama Penyelarasan Industri (JBI) Antara MITI Dengan Kerajaan Negeri Sarawak

The Sarawak State Government in collaboration with the Ministry of International Trade and Industry (MITI) has organised the 7th Jawatankuasa Bersama Penyelarasan Industri (JBI) meeting on August 18, 2009. The meeting was held at Pelagus Room, Grand Margherita Hotel, Kuching at 2.30 p.m.

The meeting was co-chaired by YB Deputy Chief Minister representing the Chief Minister of Sarawak and Minister of International Trade and Industry (MITI) and the objectives of the meeting are as follows:

- To identify issues and problems faced in the implementation of the trade and industrial policies and programs;
- To improve the Government delivery system and reduce bureaucracy and cost of doing business;
- To provide a forum for the State Government to submit proposals to enhance the trade and industrial sector.

Three (3) Discussion Papers were presented in the meeting. The first paper entitled: "Developing More Industrial Estates to Meet the Demand of SMEs throughout Sarawak" was presented by YBhg. Datu Liaw Soon Eng, the Permanent Secretary Ministry of Industrial Development.

The second paper titled "The Review of the 1970 Border Trade Agreement (BTA) Between Malaysia and the Republic of Indonesia" was presented by YBhg. Datuk Rebecca Fatima Sta Maria, the Deputy Principal Secretary of MITI.

YBhg. Dato' Afifuddin A. Kadir, the Deputy Director General I of MIDA presented the third paper entitled "Pengukuhan Unit Pelaksanaan Industri Bahagian (DIIU) bagi Negeri Sarawak".

Besides that, 13 Information Papers were also tabled in the meeting. More than 60 Head of Federal and State Departments attended the meeting.
